OCCIDENTAL PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL AWARDED TO JEAN PAULE

Longtime Alpha Councilor and Archivist Jean Paule has been awarded Occidental College's Presidential Medal for Distinguished Service. According to an article on the College website, she and former vice president for admission and financial aid Bill Tingley are the first recipients of this award. They were honored at an outdoor ceremony where their names appeared as the first entries on a dramatic metal frieze created by a local artist and blacksmith Heather McLarty.



Jean has had a long and productive career at Occidental College starting in 1950, when she was hired as executive secretary to President Arthur Coons. Except for a decade working in the travel industry, Jean has been at the College ever since, serving Coons and his successor, Richard Gilman, for 36 years. She has been the College's volunteer archivist since 1996.

In his remarks during the ceremony, Occidental College President Jonathan Veitch said: "Jean is truly an Occidental institution, whose record of service is unmatched, and whose work ethic, integrity, and professional skills continue to benefit the College today." The purpose of the Presidential Medal is to recognize administrators and staff who have had an extraordinary impact on the College.

Jean recently announced that while she could not continue on Alpha's Council, she would remain as Archivist.

In Memoriam

Alpha Association mourns the loss of two beloved and well respected Past Presidents, whose dedication and prodigious talent have contributed greatly to the Association's success: C. Scott Littleton and Verna Steinmetz.

C. Scott Littleton

Colleagues are still nonplussed at the untimely passing of Scott Littleton on November 25, 2010 in Pasadena at the age of 77 of complications from pneumonia. He had recently had heart surgery. Friendly, enthusiastic, and never at a loss for words, Scott enlivened Council meetings with his wit and charm. His appetite for technology led him to become Alpha's Webmaster. He also administered the Graduate Study Award for many years. Active at the National level, Scott had served on the Committee on Qualifications, which assesses institutions applying for PBK chapters. He was also well into his second term as Western District Chair, acting as liaison with chapter and association delegates in the Western states.



Scott was born in Los Angeles and grew up in Hermosa Beach. He served in the Army, including overseas service in Japan and Korea. Later, he received his B.A., M.A., and Ph.D from UCLA. A longtime anthropology professor and department chair at Occidental College, Scott became an internationally known expert in comparative Indo-European mythology and folklore, as well as Japanese religion. He had published extensively on Japanese myth and religion, and the origin and distribution of the Arthurian and Holy Grail legends. Scott was a devoted family man. He enjoyed world travel with his wife, Mary Ann, and was proud of his accomplished daughters, Leslie and Cynthia, and his granddaughter, Daisy.

Verna Pace Steinmetz

Verna Steinmetz died in Los Angeles on June 16, 2011 after a brief illness. She was 87. Verna was a strong pillar of Alpha Association – remaining active on Council for decades after leading as President.



Verna graduated from Stanford University with B.A. in History. Verna worked tirelessly as a volunteer and fundraiser in the art and education fields. In addition to her work with Council, she was Director of Development for Westlake School in 1968, Associate Director of Development for Stanford University in 1972, and Deputy Director of the University's Southern California office. In retirement, she was a fundraising consultant at the Huntington Library, Art Gallery, and Botanical Gardens from 1993-1998. She was a past board member of the Pasadena Senior Center and the Stanford Associates Board of Governors. She was a recipient of the Stanford Associates award.

Verna loved traveling the world, especially to exotic places. Among her many interests, she enjoyed going to the symphony, swimming, and playing bridge. It is said that she was a "formidable spelling bee contestant." Verna leaves her loving family: a sister, four children, and nine grandchildren.
